Great to hear from you! Been a LONG time.

It's been a while since I played PBEM too (I think my last game was with you). What I remember is you have to right click on the DLR icon and then set the compatibility mode. I believe you set it to Win 98. I think the game creator has to be running that way when they create the game too so try setting it, then create a game and see if you can load it successfully.

When playing online, you have to turn that compatibility mode off (all players) or it won't start the game. It's one of those annoying things about a 20+ years old game.

Not sure about the WiFi issue. Don't think you ever mentioned it. I always only had 1 NIC card in my machine so never was using WiFi. By default Windows prefers the WiFi network over a wired connection so it may be as simple as setting the wired connection to get priority (that's the metric field in the NIC card settings).
